RESOLUTION APPROVING AND CONSENTING TO WITHDRAWAL FROM THE AMENDED AND RESTATED LEHIGH-WEBSTER TRANSMISSION AND WEBSTER TERMINALS FACILITIES AND OPERATING AGREEMENT, AND APPROVING THE AMENDED AND RESTATED LEHIGH-WEBSTER TRANSMISSION AND WEBSTER TERMINALS FACILITIES AND OPERATING AGREEMENT, AS FURTHER AMENDED TO REFLECT THAT THE LAURENS MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC UTILITY IS NO LONGER AN OWNER OR PARTY THERETO

WHEREAS, the Municipal Electric Utility of the City (the "Utility") has entered into an Asset Purchase agreement with MidAmerican Energy Company for the sale of the Utility's ownership interest in certain transmission assets known as Lehigh-Webster Transmission ("Lehigh-Webster Transmission") owned pursuant to that certain Amended and Restated Lehigh-Webster Transmission and Webster Terminals Facilities and Operating Agreement, as amended (the "Transmission Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the sale of the Utility's ownership interest in the Lehigh-Webster Transmission requires an amendment of the Transmission Agreement to reflect the Utility's withdrawal therefrom and that the Utility will no longer be a participant and joint owner therein; and

WHEREAS, on the 23rd day of March, 2023 a proposed form of Amended and Restated Lehigh-Webster Transmission and Webster Terminals Facilities and Operating Agreement, as further amended, was filed with the Secretary of this governing body and preliminarily approved by resolution subject to final hearing and approval upon public notice as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Amended and Restated Lehigh-Webster Transmission and Webster Terminals Facilities and Operating Agreement, as further amended, is found to be in proper form and withdrawal therefrom is found to serve the best interest of the City, its residents and consumers of electricity furnished by the Laurens Municipal Electric Utility; and

WHEREAS, notice of hearing on the proposition of withdrawal from the proposed Amended and Restated Lehigh-Webster Transmission and Webster Terminals Facilities and Operating Agreement, as amended, was published as required by the provisions of Chapters 390 of the Code of Iowa, 2022, as amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE MUNICIPAL ELECTRIC UTILITY OF LAURENS, IOWA:

Section 1. That this governing body hereby approves and consents to withdrawal from the Amended and Restated Lehigh-Webster Transmission and Webster Terminals Facilities and Operating Agreement.

Section 3. That the Chairperson and Secretary are authorized and directed to execute any consents or other documents as may be necessary and appropriate to complete or memorialize the withdrawal and the amendment of the Amended and Restated Lehigh-Webster Transmission and Webster Terminals Facilities and Operating Agreement to reflect that the Utility is no longer an owner or party thereto.
